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Utopia

Paper Papercuts, laser cutting Site-specific installation



Simulated columns are covered with papercuts, making them look like relics of an architectural structure, with its inside on the outside. The delicate, white lace and the fluid edges of the papercuts cast a shadow on the columns, which looks like an illusory drawing of flora taking over the structure. This unsettling feeling is juxtaposed to the work's engagement in beauty and magic. The architectural link points towards the *mashrabiya* (a partition made of a repetitive geometric pattern, common feature of the traditional Arab house). The plethora of associations endows the work with an array of contradictions: nature and culture, East and West, durability and decay.

The image that is duplicated on the papercuts amalgamates the diamond model with the Gothic Rose Window. These models were simplified, deconstructed, and reconstructed into a new syntax. The image was first made in an ink drawing that has undergone computerized processing and laser cutting — a process that combines traditional techniques with contemporary technology.

עמודים מדומים מכוסים לכל אורכם במגזרות נייר ונראים כשרידי מבנה אדריכלי, שמתקיים בו היפוך בין פנים לחוץ. מרקם התחרה הלבן והעדין והקצוות הנזילים של המגזרות מטילים על העמודים צל, הנדמה כרישום מתעתע של צמחיית פרא המשתלטת על המבנה. התחושה הטורדנית המתעוררת נוכח המראה עומדת בניגוד לעיסוקה של העבודה בקסם וביופי. הקשר אדריכלי מוביל גם למשרביה (מחיצה עשויה מדגם גיאומטרי חוזר ונשנה, השכיחה בבית הערבי המסורתי). ריבוי ההקשרים מטעין את העבודה במערך של ניגודים: טבע מול תרבות, מזרח מול מערב, יציבות מול והתכלות.

הדימוי המוכפל על גבי המגזרות הינו הכלאה בין דגם היהלום ודוגמת חלון הרוזטה הגותי. אלה עברו תהליכי הפשטה, פירוק והרכבה עד ליצירת תחביר חדש. הדימוי נעשה תחילה ברישום דיו שעבר עיבוד ממוחשב וחיתוך לייזר – תהליך עבודה המשלב בין הידני המסורתי לטכנולוגי העכשווי.
